MESSAGE FROM P.O.A. PRESIDENT EVA HAWKINS

It doesn't seem possible a whole year has gone by and we will be holding elections this month. I have again accepted the nomination for president and feel honored at having been asked. We have an excellent slate and, since there were no nominations from the floor, you will be served by some of the finest, most dedicated people I know.

Even though there is no contest in the election of officers, in order to elect we must have a majority of the members voting or we will not have attained a quorum for this vote.

We are also presenting some bylaws changes. To pass these changes we must have a majority of our members voting to attain a quorum. The bylaws committee members have worked long and hard to bring our bylaws into compliance with the law and to clean up some of the language.

Our next meeting falls on Thanksgiving Eve and many of you will be
busy with company or travel. If
you are not able to attend the
meeting to cast your vote, please
vote by proxy. You will find a
proxy ballot in this bulletin.

The hot topic of conversation in 0.B.G. is the rash of burglaries we have had and the residents' concern with security.

O.B.G. management has stated that "security" is their second biggest expense to come out of our maintenance payments. Many of us have always realized that the security we

are given by management is at best minimal. The sales pitch has been so successful, however, that often when a crime occurred in the Gardens, people called security instead of the police. With the most recent rash of thefts, the truth of the state of security has become evident. Gary Morse has admitted that the gate attendants cannot stop anyone from entering the Gardens.

What we actually have at the gates are information booths for visitors since most of us know exactly where we live. It would seem that the one half million dollars that management purports to be spending on this kind of security could be utilized in an area that would benefit the residents more effectively. Another result of management's excellent selling of the security of the park is that many of our residents feel they are not really a part of Lady Lake but a self-contained community. We acted so much in this vein that Lady Lake authorities reacted by rarely being in the Gardens. Very few police cars were visible on routine patrol; mainly they responded only when called. Since the thefts, they have patrolled, responded when the emergency vehicles enter the Gardens, etc. This coverage must be an on-going thing!

We must insist that the town and the county give us our fair share of their police time. We do pay a goodly portion of the taxes that Lady Lake collects and also provide a good share of the county's income. In addition, we must be good neighbors and if we see anything suspicious, we should call the appropriate police agency. If you think a crime is occurring or about to occur, call 9-1-1.

I don't know if management's steering committee is going to be able to add to our security. We welcome any real measures management provides, but we must never become as complacent as we have been in the past.

Remember, if you are going to be away, vote by proxy and leave your proxy with your liaison officer or a neighbor who will be attending the meeting. If you are in town, please attend this most important meeting.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO P.O.A. BYLAWS

The following are the proposed amendments to the P.O.A. bylaws which are scheduled for adoption (or rejection) at the November 21st annual meeting of members.

LEGEND: Solid underscoring - headings or emphasis
Word underscoring - new language
\$1116464 \$6145 - deleted language

ARTICLE I - NAME, ADDRESS AND LOCATION (To amend by adding Section 3 to provide for an updated location of the Association.)

Section 3. The location of the Association shall be in the Villages of Orange Blossom Gardens, Silver Lake and Country Club Hills, otherwise known as Units One (1) through Thirteen (13).

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP (To amend Section 1 by adding "The Villages of" and to delete, as unnecessary language, "including employees" as they are eligible for membership by virtue of owning property. To amend Section 2(c) to state how long members of a previous calendar year will be carried on the membership rolls.)

Section 1. All bona fide owners of property in The Villages of Orange Blossom Gardens, Silver Lake and Country Club Hills, otherwise known as Units One (1) through Thirteen (13) in Ottake Blossom Gatdens! Lady Lake, Lake County, Florida, including employees of Ottake Blossom Gatdens! Ottake Blossom Wills! Incl of its management of appropriate dues.

c) members whose dues were paid for the previous calendar year shall be carried on the membership rolls $f\phi f$ no later than October lst of the current year; but such members shall not be eligible to vote until dues are paid for the entire current year.

ARTICLE IV - MEMBERSHIP DUES (To amend Section 3 by changing the year to 1990 when consideration will be given to adjustment of annual dues.)

Section 3. The amount of annual membership dues for each subsequent year shall be determined at the annual meeting of members in November after presentation and adoption of an annual budget, beginning with the year 1989 1990.

ARTICLE V - RESIGNED OR DELINQUENT MEMBERSHIPS (To amend Section 1 to delete the words "upon request" as unnecessary language.)

Section 1. Delinquent or resigned memberships may be reinstated which tedutest by payment of all past and current dues.

ARTICLE VI - MEMBERSHIP CARDS (To amend Section 2 to clarify wording and add special meetings as a time when membership cards will also be required for admittance.)

Section 2. Members shall be required to show a current membership card for admittance to any neeting at which a vote is to be taken the annual meeting of members and any special meeting at which a quorum vote is required.

ARTICLE VII - MEETINGS (To provide clearer language regarding meetings and to delete all references to joint meetings as unnecessary since Board meetings are open to members. To re-number Sections 4, 5 and 6 as Sections 3, 4 and 5, respectively, and to delete Section 7 and insert a new Section 6.)

Section I. Annual neetings of nembers shall be held on the third Wednest day in the month of november each feat. Beginning with the feat 1990! following adoption of these bylans under the profisions of the prefique bylans.

Section 1. Meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held at 7:30 p.m. on the third Wednesday of the eight (8) months of December, January, February, March, April, May, September and October each year and at such other times as the Board may deem necessary.

The purpose of the annual meeting of members shall be for the adoption of amendments to the bylaws, if any have been proposed, the election of officets and of the members to the Board of Directors, adoption of an annual budget, and for the transaction of such other business as may come before the meeting.

ARTICLE VII - MEETINGS - continued

Section 43. Special meetings for any purpose, unless otherwise prescribed by statute, may be called by the President, or by a majority of the Board of Directors, or shall be called by the President or Secretary upon written request of ten (10) per cent of the $\psi \phi t i \psi t$ members eligible to vote.

(Section 5 was re-numbered to read Section 4, and Section 6 was re-numbered to read Section 5; and the third paragraph of Section 5 was amended to read as follows:)

The Board of Directors may, at its discretion, elect to schedule a social event for Association members and guests; and, if such event is to be held in the Orange Blossom Gardens Recreation Club House, $\phi n \neq \phi f t \neq \phi t$

Section 7/ Neetings are open to all nembers in good standing and to prope etty owners who are desirous of becoming nembers!

Section 6. Except for annual and special meetings when members are required to show a current membership card for admittance, meetings are open to all members and to property owners in the Villages of Orange Blossom Gardens, Silver Lake and Country Club Hills who are desirous of becoming members.

ARTICLE IX - MINUTES OF MEETINGS (To amend Section 1 to provide for combined minutes and the effective date of this provision. To amend Section 2 to eliminate waiver of reading minutes and to clarify when minutes are read.)

Section 1. The minutes of all meetings of ###### the Board of Directors meeting with members shall be combined, beginning with the fiff annual meeting of members and of the with the Board of Directors, following adoption of amendments to these the bylaws in November 1989 1990.

Section 2. Valess the reading of whites is waited himsels Minutes from each preceding monthly, annual or special meeting shall be read at the following monthly, annual or special meeting.

ARTICLE X - CONDUCT OF MEETINGS (To amend Section 4(d) to delete waiver of reading of minutes; and to amend Section 4(g) by deleting the words "officers and or" to conform to another proposed amendment.)

ARTICLE X - CONDUCT OF MEETINGS - continued

Section 4. The order of business of all annual meetings, and as far as practical at other meetings, shall be as follows:

- a) Call to order
- b) Roll call
- c) Proof of notice of meeting (or waiver of notice)
- d) Reading of minutes of previous meeting whiles waived
- e) Report of officers
- f) Report of committees
- g) Election of officets and of directors (if an election is to be held)
- h) Unfinished business
- i) New business
- j) Motion to adjourn

ARTICLE XI - QUORUMS (To amend Section 1 to specify which meetings require a quorum and which do not. To amend Section 2 to substitute the word "eligible" to vote for the word "entitled" to vote.)

Section 1. The presence in person or by proxy of a majority of members thilled eligible to vote shall be required for the purpose of constituting a quorum at any annual or special meeting at which a vote is to be taken to adopt amendments to bylaws and to elect members to the Board of Directors / but a divotate that the transfer of the state of the state

Section 2. Decisions shall be made by a majority of members represented at a meeting at which a quorum is present; and the affirmative vote of members present and ##11144 eligible to vote shall be the act of the Association.

ARTICLE XII - VOTING ELIGIBILITY (To amend Section 1 and insert a new Section 2 to establish when renewed and new memberships will be accepted to be eligible to vote at annual and special meetings. To re-number Sections 2, 3 and 4 as Sections 3, 4 and 5, respectively, and to amend Section 3 to substitute the word "eligible" to vote for the word "entitled" to vote.)

Section 1. Any member whose membership dues are unpaid for the current year shall **\phi t \overline{be} \frac{\text{required}}{\text{to}} \overline{\text{to renew membership no later than}} \frac{0ctober 1st to}{at \text{to}} \text{ be eligible to vote at \frac{\psi \psi}{\psi \psi} \frac{\text{the annual meeting in November}}{\text{at which a quorum vote is to be taken required.}}

Nor will such delinquent member be permitted to renew membership on the date of any special meeting at which a quorum vote is required.

PROCEDURE FOR VOTING

The bylaws of the Orange Blossom Gardens Property Owners' Association, Inc. require a quorum of a majority of members to vote at annual meetings to adopt proposed amendments to the bylaws and to elect officers and members to the Board of Directors.

Two methods of voting are provided for which will enable us to achieve the required majority for a quorum.

- 1) members present at the meeting vote by ballot, and
- 2) members who cannot attend the meeting vote by proxy.

REMEMBER: The majority referred to is one-half of the membership households - plus one with one member per household voting.

TO VOTE IN PERSON BY BALLOT:

- a) Tear out this ballot and bring it to the annual meeting of members on November 21st.
- b) Be prepared to present your 1990 membership card before casting your vote.
- P.O.A. members will be present on or before 6:30 p.m. to afford you ample time to vote before the meeting is convened at 7:30 p.m.


