UPDATE ON CABLE TV AND GARBAGE PICK-UP FEES

As reported in the May Bulletin the date of the POA settlement with the developer (also known as Orange Blossom Gardens or the Villages) is in dispute. An agreement was signed on February 4, 1991 that was to be accepted by "the Class" (people residing in Units 1 through 13) who agreed with the terms. A hearing before the Court with Judge Aulls presiding was held on April 9, 1991. He affirmed that the Agreement was accepted and signed it as a completed agreement.

At any time between February 4, 1991 and April 9, 1991, the Agreement could have been voided.

Attorney Dewey Burnsed disputes that this Agreement was not final until April 9th. He also maintains that a decision by the developer and its Board was reached in December to begin charging every new resident and resale both cable TV and garbage pick-up fees in order to maintain its cap of \$89.00 amenities fee.

This was to be effective January 1, 1991. Attorney Burnsed states that ERA Realty and Coldwell Banker Realty were notified to inform resale buyers. It was not known to other realtors or people who sold their own homes.

The POA has been asked by six (6) people to help them resolve charges that they did not know about when they bought their homes.

The Negotiating Committee met with Gary Morse (CEO and Vice-President of Orange Blossom Hills, the developer) in March. He preferred to have the attorneys involved Dewey Burnsed (developer's attorney) and Chris Jayson (POA litigating attorney) come to a decision.

Attorney Burnsed wrote to Attorney Jayson restating his (Mr. Burnsed's) position as to the effective date of the Agreement and the position of the developer that January 1, 1991 was actually the date charges for cable TV and garbage pick-up began. Attorney Jayson changed law firms from John Allen Association in Petersburg, to Barry Cohen Law Office in Tampa. Many phone calls and letters from the POA were not answered by Attorney Jayson. Finally, Attorney Jayson responded by affirming April 9th as the effective date and stating he would no longer represent us in any further negotiations. The POA has H. Scott Herman on retainer. requested a meeting with Gary Morse, Dewey Burnsed, the POA Negotiating Committee (Dorothy Hokr and Al Arico) and himself. Mr. Morse declined to attend and Attorney Burnsed had authority to settle any claims.

On August 25, 1991, Attorney Herman and the Committee met with Attorney Burnsed. Unfortunately, nothing was resolved. There was no spirit of cooperation and good will. Attorney Burnsed would not accept April 9, 1991 as the effective date of the POA and developer's Agreement.

He would not accept the six (6) names we wanted to assist in their dispute. Attorney Burnsed will only deal with these cases on an individual basis.

It would appear that delay and denial are used to discourage any one from receiving the full services that was promised when a purchase was made. For some people \$30.00 or \$40.00 per month can be a "budget buster". However, whether or not the fees can be afforded, promises made should be honored.

And so the saga goes on - maybe we should start a count of months. This dispute has been going on since July, 1991.

How much longer is anyone's guess. At the September 16th meeting, we hope to have further information.



HURRICANE ANDREW - PROJECT COPE

On August 25, 1992 the Town of Lady Lake received an urgent message by facsimile from Mr. Bill Evers of the Florida League of Cities requesting disaster relief caused by hurricane Andrew under PROJECT COPE (Cities Outreach Program Effort).

On August 26th the Town responded to the PROJECT COPE request by establishing drop-off points at both fire stations and Town Hall for relief supplies.

As of September 3rd, Lady Lake has delivered five (5) truck loads of supplies to the Homestead area and has collected approximately \$6,500.00. Monetary donations have been used to purchase over 4,000 gallons of water and 550 loaves of bread. Remaining funds will be forwarded directly to the City of Homestead for distribution.

The Town has also been requested by Mr. Michael J. Roberto, Florida City and County Managers Association (FCCMA), President to assist with rebuild efforts. Approximately 500 City and County employees in the Homestead/Dade County area are without shelter due to damage to their homes. Efforts are now underway by the Town to recruit local volunteers to help rebuild.

GLENN SWINDLER has contributed much time and his resources to help those in need! THANK YOU TO ALL THE VOLUNTEERS!! A donation of \$100.00 was made by the POA to the disaster relief fund.
