MESSAGE FROM P.O.A. PRESIDENT EVA M. HAWKINS

I trust your Summer and your travels were pleasant and you are all back home safe and sound. I hope you are well rested because we have a lot of work ahead of us this year.

Last January, I laid out our agenda for the year. If you remember, I said we had three main goals for this year: 1. To increase membership, we have done that. 2. Improve our Blood Bank. We have distributed 70 pints of replacement blood in the past six months on behalf of our residents. We are still working to improve even further by extending the area of service. 3. We discussed getting some legislation passed in the State that would force all developers throughout the State who collect amenity or maintenance fees to provide residents an accounting of those fees. It has always been my contention that amenity fees should not be a profit making item. If they are, there tends to be an escalation clause built in so that profits keep going up. At the present time, we are at the mercy of the developer because we have no legislation to combat unwarranted increases. Working with the hundred of thousands of people in Florida in a similar situation makes us a force to be considered. We don't presume to want to control the developer's profits but do not feel amenity fees should be spent on anything that does not directly benefit the resident. For example, we have some shoddy looking palm trees that could use trimming. I would rather have our area spruced up than to plant flowers and a sprinkling system on the median on 441/27. We will have no control unless we get some legislation that will benefit the people instead of special interests.

The Board and your Liaison Representatives met and worked over the Summer months. Two of the most frequently reported complaints to your representatives were "What happened to the street sweeper?" and "What happened to our oxygen truck?" I checked on the oxygen. As you know, many years ago the POA supplied oxygen for our residents. When the park got larger, management offered to incorporate the oxygen with the Security cars. About two years ago this practice was stopped because the County provided the "red truck" which carried oxygen and generally preceded the ambulance on calls. That truck is no longer on the premises. Our Security cars carry fire extinguishers, first aid equipment and most of the drivers are trained in CPR. I asked MONICA ANDERSON, our Liaison with Management and the Director of Amenities if they couldn't also carry the oxygen tanks. She will check with their risk people and get back to us. I then asked her about the street sweeper. I was advised that Management never swept our streets but only cleaned up after building debris and since there is relatively little building going on our side, the sweeper was being used on the other side where considerable building is going on. She further stated that the streets belong to Lady Lake and we pay taxes so it's Lady Lake's responsibility to sweep the streets. I corrected MONICA because I can remember when the sweeper cleaned the streets and further although I pay taxes to Lady Lake County, the taxes I pay OBG are much more. This is another prime example of benefits we had and no longer have and amenity costs going up!





LAKE COUNTY EVACUATION ROUTES

If you choose to evacuate Lake County in the event of an approaching hurricane, the major routes are listed on this map.

Please make sure if your decision has been made to leave Lake County instead of utilizing the Emergency Shelters, that your evacuation is done early to avoid possible travel into the hurricane's path.

Leaving from the West part of the County:

U.S. 441 to Leesburg S.R. 44 in Leesburg to I-75 Entrance at Wildwood I-75 North Leaving from the East part of the County:

U.S. 441 to S.R. 46 in Mount Dora S.R. 46 East to I-4 I-4 to I-95 in Daytona Beach I-95 North

Leaving from the South part of the County:

U.S. 27 North the Florida's Tumpike Florida's Tumpike North to I-75 I-75 North

HURRICANE INFORMATION
