Minutes of the December meeting were approved as read.

Treasurer's report indicated receipts for December 2015 were \$34,755 (up related to our new long term membership options); expenses were \$16,048; with net operating cash flow of \$18,707. We are in the process of updating our income tracking related to the new membership options.

Membership report that to date we have 4400 household members slightly more than at this time in 2015. Numbers are important as they give us a stronger voice in the community. Betty Cunningham of SHINE reminded attendees that SHINE provides free unbiased information on Medicare options. Regularly scheduled seminars will be listed in the SUN newspaper.

Liza Walters from CERT (community emergency response team) spoke to the group about how this organization benefits the Villages and asked for support by attending a concert at the West Lake Presbyterian Church.

Representatives available at the back of the room for individual questions and handouts include: Seniors v. Crime, SHINE, CERT and representatives from Realty Executives.

The cash raffle gave three lucky winners \$30 each.
