The <u>SHINE</u> report reminded attendees that new Medicare cards are scheduled to be coming in the mail in June. The cards, reportedly, will be made of cardboard and laminating the card could ruin the numbers. Betty will be retiring from SHINE in March and she introduced Becky will be taking her place.

The <u>2017 Hall of Fame</u> designee, Myron Henry, was honored. His contributions during his 8 years with the POA include: the design of our logo, fill-in secretary, authoring Bulletin articles, fostered the striping of the golf cart paths, and many other endeavors for all of us.

The cash raffle gave 3 lucky winners \$30 each.
