At the tables in the back of the room were representatives from Seniors v. Crime, SHINE, District Gov., Clear Captions, and Realty Executives available for individual questions or concerns.

The cash raffle made 3 lucky attendees each \$30 richer.

<u>Open forum</u> is the time we take questions from the audience that may be of interest to all residents. Responses may appear in future Bulletin articles.

What can be done about a car parked in the street for many days?

Speakers: For the second time, we were proud to have John Thompson, founder of Good Foundation Florida, Ron Broadick, President and CEO of Earth Tech, and Barry Smith, founder of Pinnacle Engineering here to discuss aspects of sinkholes of interest and concern to Villagers. Sinkholes have developed in the Villages, of interest and concern to many. Additionally, the insurance rates we pay are high and Villagers need to understand how this coverage works given the updates to the insurance laws of Florida passed by our legislature in 2011. After a multitude of questions and expressed concerns, the meeting was adjourned at 8:45 PM.
